Year 2

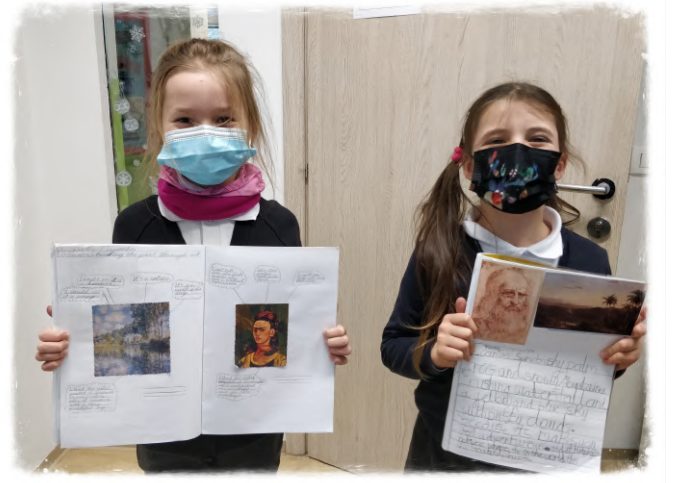

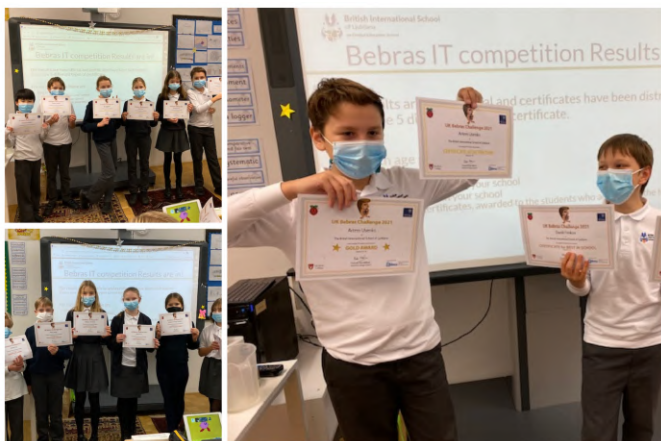


Year 5 are working on their final art pieces with a focus on shading and light. We all cannot wait to see the finished product!

On Monday this week, we were developing new skills which we will need for our expedition, as we do every week.



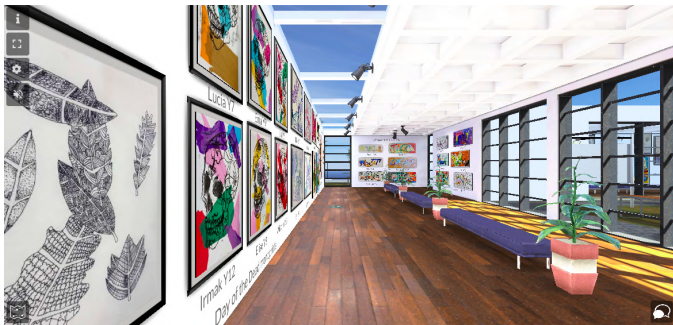
