Students will work through one or more extended projects and explore a range of artists, techniques, and styles to develop their practical skills in accordance with the AQA GCSE Assessment Objectives. This work may be submitted as part of Component 1: Portfolio.

Topics	<p>Introductory phase Foundation studies- Component 1: Portfolio 60%</p> <p>Students are introduced to a range of practical teacher-led workshops based on a theme selected by the teacher.</p> <p>Students explore and experiment with a variety of materials, processes and techniques, and investigate different kinds of sources.</p> <p>Students explore a variety of approaches to drawing and written annotation.</p> <p>The work is presented in sketchbook format alongside outside pieces.</p>	<p>Development phase Directed project- Component 1: Portfolio 60%</p> <p>Students work on a directed project or a number of mini projects to build on their initial experiences and knowledge, understanding and skills developed from the introductory phase.</p> <p>Look at the work of relevant artists to see how they have employed techniques to represent their concepts.</p> <p>Students will respond to the artists' work through a range of mediums based on their own photography.</p> <p>Students will annotate and compare the work of selected artists using visual language.</p>	<p>Extension project Component 1: Portfolio 60%</p> <p>Following the Development Phase, students fully engage with their given theme and make a personal response when developing.</p> <p>Students produce work related to their previous Development Phase studies or in the form of an additional and discrete project.</p> <p>They will respond to the topic by producing personal responses and a final outcome.</p>
