Dear Parents and Students,

There have been a number of creative arts events during this week, including the **Year 3 art exhibition** on Thursday, where students showcased their wonderful artwork and poems, and the **Secondary art exhibition** on Friday, visited by parents and students across the school. **The Year 1** class impressed us with their performance, artwork and poems linked to their Topic of *Light*.



The Year 1 class also visited the Ljubljana <u>Puppet</u> <u>Theatre</u> and Puppet Museum on Tuesday to watch the show *Sovica Oka* and use their Slovene language skills. Further trips in Primary will be planned for the upcoming months, as the days get warmer with the coming of Spring.

Following discussions on the **school lunches**, Super Catering will be conducting a survey to collate information and feedback to inform future planning and provision of wider choices and variety. From March the Early Years menu will be reviewed in order to cater for the needs and palates of our younger students. Early Years

In the Early Years, we started with a topic where we will focus on one of Julia Donaldson's books each week. 
